

Suggestion: Use the following script to share with children about Steve's Story. Review the story asking who, what, and why questions; then open the Bible to read corresponding scripture and reassuring truths. If using the Missions Kit for a 5 day VBS or camp, use one section per day, taking time to review the previous day.

Print the following pages (2-11 only) front and back on cardstock for leaders to show children as they read the story on the back.

For Coloring Pages, simply print pages 2,4,6,8, and 10 for each child.

Pro Tip: Printing 2-11 front and back pages would allow parents to know and review the entire story with their children.



Baby Steve Needed Help:

In Spartanburg, there was a baby named Steve. He lived with his family in a small apartment that was loud and dirty. Baby Steve was sick but his parents didn't know. He felt sad because he was hungry and needed help. One day, Baby Steve met a doctor who wanted to help.

Questions to Ask:

What was Baby Steve's home like? Loud and dirty


Why did he need help? He was sick.

Why was Steve unhappy? He was hungry.

Reassuring Truth:

God always hears our cries.

Doctors Help Baby Steve:

Baby Steve's parents did not know how to take good care of him.

The doctor sent Steve to the hospital to get help. Nurses there gave him special milk.

Steve began to feel stronger.

Questions to Ask:

Where did Steve go? To the hospital.


Who helped him? The doctors and nurses.

How did they help? They gave him special milk.

Reassuring Truth:

God is our safe place. He always listens.

Sarah Helps Baby Steve:

Steve's parents had to leave. A kind nurse named Sarah helped him every day. Steve had a special surgery that helped him eat better. Sarah became Steve's special helper, called a foster mom. Steve moved to Sarah's house where he met a loving family and had a crib and toys!

Questions to Ask:

Why did Baby Steve have surgery? To help him eat



Who was Sarah? Steve's new foster mom

What did Sarah do? Took care of him, spent time with him.

Reassuring Truth:

God takes care of us.

Martha Helps Baby Steve:

Sarah called PS I Love You Ministries for help. A lady named Martha answered the phone. She packed clothes, diapers, and blankets for Baby Steve. Martha also planned a Christmas surprise for Steve.

Questions to Ask:

Who helped Sarah? Martha at PS I Love You

What did PS I Love You give Steve? Clothes, diapers, blankets

What holiday was coming? Christmas!

Reassuring Truth:

God provides for us.

“God will meet all of your needs”

Baby Steve Gets Stronger:

Christmas was a special day for Baby Steve! He got lots of presents. Baby Steve was very happy. As he grew, he began to sit up and crawl. Therapists helped him get stronger and try new foods. Steve grew big and healthy with his foster family!

Questions to Ask:

What did Steve get for Christmas? Presents

How did Steve feel? Happy

Who helped Steve get big and healthy? Foster Family

Reassuring Truth:

God strengthens us.
