This first quarter of 2023 has been a busy one! After the flood on Christmas Eve, we saw God move in a mighty way to arrange contractors and helpers. With their help, we were able to keep the Resource Center operational and move forward with our expansion goals during the process!

Our Donation Center moved (next door) and we have completed the necessary repairs to reopen the half of the building affected by the flood. Our offices have been restored and we moved into the NEW Infant Clothing/Equipment space. Families have been so excited to shop in the new area!

This change allowed us to expand our teen clothing area as well. This exciting step of our expansion plan is truly a blessing for our families, who visit the Resource Center!

a lonely journey

Susan's transition into foster care was a whirlwind! She had general training, but very little preparation or information about the behavioral, mental or educational needs of her new foster children.

Their needs quickly became apparent, but there was no clear pathway to services or solutions. Her new normal became a lonely journey of meltdowns, research, and failed attempts to get diagnoses and services. Susan never confided with others about the struggles, for fear that her children would be treated differently.

There was no community. After 2 years they received an educational diagnosis. It took 7 years to find a counselor, who specialized in children with trauma, and 10 years went by before she found true community within a support group.

Because of that experience, God birthed a deep passion to make sure that foster families have support, education, practical trainings, tools, and connections to professional resources in our area. At PS I Love You, we are that support! We show foster parents the path and walk it with them.

Christmas Blessings

This year for Christmas we partnered with DSS to sponsor all foster children from Spartanburg county in foster homes. This allowed us to form a better relationship with the caseworkers in our county, as well as expand the number of foster children that we serve at Christmas. This was a huge undertaking, as we packed 236 bags full of specific wishlist items, toys, clothes, and necessities (socks, pjs, underwear). We also made sure each child received a stocking full of goodies and a stuffed animal.

God provided organizations that held toy drives and sponsors that sponsored a child (\$250 value). God always finds a way to provide for His children! We could not make Christmas possible for so many without the help of our community. Thank you for your help in making this possible!
