It was loud, and his cries for help didn't get anyone's attention. Baby Steve was sad and no one smiled at him.

Feeling hungry became so normal that Baby Steve didn't cry about it anymore. He was forgetting how to suck a bottle and he stopped growing. His mom and dad would hold him but they didn't know what he needed. They didn't realize how sick
